

Prohibition of alcoholic beverages and poisons

Production, distribution, dispensation, possession or use of illegal drug or controlled substances, University policy prohibits possession or sale of drug paraphernalia, and the non-prescription of public steroids.

This policy is intended to create an environment that promotes and reinforces healthy, responsible living, respect for community and campus standards and regulations; the individual's responsibility within the community; and the intellectual, social, emotional, spiritual or ethical, and physical well-being of university community members.

Policy:

Lenoir-Rhyne University entered into affiliation with the network of colleges and universities committed to the elimination of drug and alcohol abuse. In doing so, the University committed itself to a policy which is consistent with federal, state, and local law regarding the use of alcohol and illicit or controlled substances. In compliance with the Drug-Free Workplace Act of 1988, employees are hereby notified that employment at Lenoir-Rhyne University is conditional upon abiding by the conditions of these statements and prohibitions. Furthermore, the Drug-Free Schools and Communities Act of 1986 and Amendments of 1989 require that institutions of higher education adhere to the standards of conduct that clearly prohibit the unlawful possession, use, or distribution of illicit drug and alcohol by students and employees on its property or as part of any of its activities."
