Each potential candidate to the LenoirRhyne Charles M. Snipes School of Business must make application to LenoirRhyne University. LenoirRhyne University will waive the admissions application fee for students who have completed the AAS in Entrepreneurship degree from AshevilleBuncombe Technical Community College. Upon acceptance by the University, each student will be assigned an academic advisor to assist in planning course selection and sequencing. Each student is encouraged to consult with the advisor in the program.

The applicant must:

1. Be accepted by LenoirRhyne University (LR.)
2. Successfully complete the AAS in Entrepreneurship degree from AshevilleBuncombe Technical Community College (ABT.)
3. Have an overall cumulative GPA of a minimum in all collegiate level course work, from all institutions attended since high school graduation (or equivalent).

*These numbers are estimates based on the assumption that students followed the outline above. Students who have taken courses not listed as part of this agreement may still receive transfer credit for the courses taken but cannot be guaranteed to meet the minimum standards of the LR Core and/or Major curriculums. In the rare case a student has satisfied all core and major course requirements but has not yet earned a minimum of 128 credit hours, additional course credits must be earned at Lehigh for degree completion.

Example Curriculum Layout at Lenoir-Rhyne University

Below is an example of how students participating in this articulation agreement could satisfy the BA degree requirements at Lenoir-Rhyne in two years (four semesters.) This is just an example and not a prescribed schedule. Students must take at least 12 hours each semester to be considered fulltime and should average 16 hours per semester in order to complete the BA degree within two years (Six or less terms) Note: Lenoir-Rhyne cannot guarantee that required courses are offered every semester. Course availability is largely determined by enrollment and demand. Please consult with Academic Advising for selection and degree requirement planning.
